Stewardship at All Saints'

Stewardship is a way we live out our spiritual relationship with God. We express this relationship and commitment to God through our financial support of the church. Stewardship is a personal decision for each of us. At All Saints' stewardship is not required for membership, but it is encouraged.

As part of the Diocese of Alabama, All Saints' urges each household to base its stewardship pledge upon a percent of its income. This is known as proportional giving. Below is an income/proportional giving chart to help you with this.

What is Proportional Giving? It is as simple as giving in relation to what you have or in relation to what you have been given. You might think of it as a fraction or percentage.

What proportion does All Saints' expect me to give? All Saints' does not expect any particular proportion. That is for you to decide. The Biblical standard for stewardship is the 10% tithe. Some people begin by pledging less than 10% and increase their percentage each year. Some people give 10% and others give even more.
